

# NORTHERN IRELAND SCOUT CENTRE CRAWFORDSBURN

## Chalet

- This is a fully equipped self-catering residential building, to accommodate forty-six people.
- Bedrooms have a wash hand basin and a storage cupboard per person, bedding supplied.
- The building is fully centrally heated, toilet facilities, showers, drying room and internal lift.
- Includes a main fully equipped kitchen, with kitchenettes on each floor.
- There are two large activity rooms for dining, sitting or activity and a room for leaders.
- Rates include bed linen, however you will be required to make the beds up on arrival.

## Cedar Lodge

- This is a fully equipped self-catering residential building, to accommodate twenty-four people.
- Bedrooms are all en-suite and storage locker per person, bedding supplied.
- The building is fully centrally heated, toilet facilities and showers
- Includes a main fully equipped kitchen.
- There is a large activity room for dining, sitting or activity and a room for leaders.
- Rates include bed linen, however you will be required to make the beds up on arrival.

## Chalet and Cedar Lodge

- Bookings may be made up to 14 months in advance.
- Northern Ireland and County events may be reserved further in advance by arrangement.
- A 20% non returnable deposit (or £100 whichever is less) is required to confirm booking within two weeks of making the booking (reservation cannot be guaranteed without deposit being paid).
- If cancellation takes place within six weeks of the expected arrival then the client is liable for the full costs if alternative arrangements cannot be put in place, detailed cancellation policy available from the site.

## Camp Sites and Camping Pods

- Main Field and Training Field used for camping.
- Water taps situated around the site.
- Toilet and shower facilities are at the all-weather Centre
- Washing up sluices are found at the all-weather Centre.
- Camping equipment can be hired, price on request.
- There are four pods on site that sleep up to 6 people.

## SOME GENERAL COMMENTS ABOUT THE SITE

Rules are displayed on site for your information but please note some of the key points below:

For scouting overnights a Leader should ensure they have their "Nights Away Permit".

A tuck shop on site opens at pre-defined times, if you require this facility at other times please enquire. It is requested that users do not bring and run their own tuck shop.

**SITE ACTIVITIES** – To enable programme and activity planning, all activities must be pre-arranged and booked in advance. The warden in charge however has the authority to cancel activities for safety and/or other site specific reasons. Hence our recommendation that you have a foul weather programme considered in advance.

Equipment for self run, on site activities is available; please ask (in advance) for details and availability. If you require ropes, spars, alter fires etc. consider listing these with your enquiry.

## SITE ROUTINE

*0930 hours – Flag break  
1000 hours – Site Activities or your own schedule.  
1200 hours – Lunch  
1400 hours to 1700 hours – Site activities or your own schedule.  
1700 hours to 2300 hours – Free Time.  
2300 hours – LIGHTS OUT AND STRICT QUIET TIME.*

## At the END OF CAMP or at the END OF A DAY VISIT

*All fires must be extinguished before 1400 hours (except by prior arrangement).*

*On completion of a visit to the site the leader in charge is responsible to ensure:-*

- *All unused or partially burnt wood is returned to the wood pile.*
- *All litter is disposed of correctly.*
- *Any alter fire used has been cleaned out and returned to storage at the wood compound.*
- *That the site is left as you would expect to find it.*

*Please ensure contact is made with the Warden in Charge before departure.*
