The Cub Scout Team are introducing a Challenge Award for Cub Scouts in Northern Ireland, the aim of the award is to try and encourage leaders to ensure their Cubs take part in the out in Scouting.



We have chosen to make number one a compulsory requirement, we are aware that this may prove difficult for a Cub with a disability, but we ask that leaders use their discretion and apply logic in these situations, (perhaps a Cub Scout is unable to sleep over but can attend the residential during the day) credit should be given (number one is achieved).

The award will run from 1st May 2014 so credit can be given to any of the above tasks undertaken from that date.

To gain the award a Cub must complete Task 1 plus seventeen others.

The badge can be worn on the **left** sleeve of the cub uniform. Please make sure that Northern Ireland is the correct way up.
